BATCE Celebrates 23 CAPE Scholarship Winners

In the Open Scholarship Category, BATCE Sixth Form placed 7th nationally and placed 5th in the Additional Scholarship category. BATCE also placed first among Anglican Secondary Schools and 6th among denominational schools. Of the 23 Scholars 17 were females ad 6 were males. Three (3) males were awarded Open scholarships in the areas of Math, General Studies and ICT.T

Three (3) males were awarded Additional Scholarships in the areas General Studies, Business Studies and ICT.
